## A Discourse on How to Keep Your Deliverance

The most secure way of keeping your deliverance is to ensure you are guided by The Holy Spirit in all you do and love as with the same quality of love with which God loves and that Jesus is Lord of all you do. In other words you practice Lordship and Holiness (which rejects all that Jesus would not approve of).

Rom 8:14 For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.

This is why you need to hear The Holy Spirit 24/7 so you know you are always doing God;'s Will because if you are not He will place unease in you mind an take away yout peace,

# Introduction

Keeping your deliverance is really Kingdom living - living as a member of God's Family and as a citizen of The Kingdom of God and developing the relationship you have with your family. This discourse is a brief statement on how to live as a citizen of The Kingdom and as a member of the Family of God.

Matthew 6:33-34 But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof.

Our objective in life should be to seek the purposes of The King in every area of our relationships: to God, Satan, self, family, friends, Christians, non-Christians, all we come into contact with in our daily life. We should not be concerned about the future as that is the responsibility of The King. The promise is that as we seek His purposes (His Kingdom) and His Righteousness (being in a correct relationship with Him), He will supply all our needs to live and serve Him. That includes our needs for living on this earth, spiritual growth, maturity, ministry and rewards in that order as well as anything prophesied for us (Matt 6:33).

To keep your deliverance you must stay in The Kingdom, obeying its rules, serving its King, defending it, being used to expand it, and putting it first in all you do. Matthew 6:33 applies here and is really directed toward a citizen of The Kingdom (as is the rest of the Sermon on The Mount).

To keep your deliverance, you need to know the four 'R's: your Relationships, Rights, Responsibilities and Rewards. In other words, you need to understand what God will allow you to do, what you can ask Him for, how you are to relate to Him, and what rewards He has to make it all worthwhile. We must believe two things: God is a rewarder (Hebrews 11:6); and that your deliverance is worth keeping. We must believe the latter in order to keep our deliverance.

Along with the four 'R's, there are the three 'P's: His Protection, His Provision and His Providence (His control and directing of our lives). These 'P's are how God governs us, protects us, provides for us and plans our lives for His Glory and our benefit.

Then there are the two 'W's, the two witnesses that God uses to guide us: The Word (The Bible) and the Witness of The Holy Spirit. This is how God speaks to us, teaches us and directs us for His purposes.

Then there is the one 'J', Jesus who made it all possible (our Lord, Saviour and Ruler of The Kingdom of God).

We need to know these basic things and how to develop them in our life in order to keep our deliverance.

# The Basic Message is Love

I asked The Holy Spirit what was the chief message of this section (and indeed this booklet). He said that God is Love and everything He does is a result of His Love. Satan tries to make us fearful (negate God's Love) or to distract or deceive us so that we cannot see or appreciate God's Love. He tries to damage us so God cannot use us for His purposes. If Satan can deceive us about God or distract us from His Will, then we will start to do things which Satan can use to take us further away from God, such as worry, anxiety, and fear. So, the message God wanted to convey in this section is that He is Love and everything He does toward us is out of this Love. We should not fear what happens as God's Love is in control.

There are no accidents with God!

It is this love that drives us to the ministry of deliverance: guiding people from Satan's realm to God's then delivering them from the things Satan has placed on them,

# **Examples of His Love are:**

- Sending Jesus to teach us His requirements, then having Him die for each one of us to so we could be reconciled with God and thus relate to God
- Bringing us into His Spiritual Kingdom
- Delivering us from the kingdom of darkness and its effects on us as well as from the fate of its citizens
- Taking us to Heaven when we die to a mansion He has prepared for us
- Testing us and bringing us into trials (which also shows His love) to mature us into His Image.
- Punishing/Correcting/Chastising us in a way so as to turn us from error, rather than destroying or crippling us so that we cannot do anything
- Giving us the privilege of serving Him
- Taking a personal interesting us to develop us to the fullest potential we allow Him too.

# How does this apply to us?

We need to love others as God loves them. It is a command (Jn. 13:34-35) so there is no choice in this. We must understand God's Love to others as then we will be able to love as He loves.

You need to trust God's Love and express this through the principles of Mat 6:33 that as you, faith seek a deeper relationship with Him and the expansion of His Kingdom He will provide all you need to do His work by expressing His love to others in all you do.

# The Relevance of The Kingdom of God

I asked The Holy Spirit what to teach about Kingdom. The Holy Spirit said that "without faith it is impossible to please Him". He also said to love God with your whole heart, soul, mind and strength and to love your neighbour as yourself. This is The Kingdom and sums up all the Law and The Prophets.

The first part is a reference to Hebrews 11:6. You must believe that God is who He says He is, that what He says is true and that His rewards are worth the effort of

following and obeying Him. The second is a reference to the summary of the Law and the New Commandment of Jesus (Luke 10:26,27 and John 13:34,35, Deuteronomy 6:5; Matthew 22:37; Matthew 22:39; Mark 12:30.)

We are to express God's Love and Character to all we meet and in all we do (especially in ministering on His behalf). Anything that is not done in God's Quality of Love is not of God or of His Character. This is perhaps the single best guideline to keeping your salvation.

Whenever we interact with anyone we are to show God's Love. We might not like what they do but we are to love them as God Loves them. The exceptions being demons but even then we are to relate to them in the way Jesus wants us to relate to them. A test of our faith is how we express God's love through us to others. Gods is Love and if we believe in Him and who He is we will show that same love to all around us as well as to ourself.

### The Approach to this Discourse

You have been delivered from the kingdom of darkness(hell) to the Kingdom of Light; (heaven) therefore, you need to look at your deliverance in light of your citizenship in the Kingdom of Light. You have eternal life as a result of your relationship with Jesus and the Father, therefore, you will need to look at maintaining your salvation in the light of these relationships. Also, The Holy Spirit has been sent to guide you in these relationships so you will need to be able to hear His guidance as well as any understanding He gives of a situation or relationship.

Developing an intimate love relationship with Jesus and The Father as guided by The Holy Spirit is necessary for you to keep your salvation. Unfortunately, this is not taught in churches and is rarely taught anywhere else; yet, it is the core of working at keeping your salvation and your life with Them in eternity.

There are the three major areas to keep in mind in regard to maintaining your deliverance:

First of all, how you get into this relationship with the Father and Jesus, so you can be delivered from the Kingdom of Darkness and its effects on you,

Secondly, what you are delivered from and what you are delivered to,

Thirdly, you need to look at the 'R's, the 'P's and the 'W's as well as how Jesus fits into the scheme of things.

Then, underlying all of this is God's Love, which is the basis for all these interactions. Without His Love, these interactions don't even occur and we will look to our own selfish ends. Ignoring God's Love in us will result in serving our own selfish pleasures and our fleshly lusts rather than expressing God's purposes and His Love.

We should be motivated to serve God because of what His Love has done, is doing, and will do for us. Because everything God allows to happen to us is a result of His love, we should be thankful in all that occurs to us regardless of whether or not we understand why it is happening.

#### What Is the Gospel

The foundation of The Gospel is that God loved us when we did not deserve this love and sent Jesus to died on the Cross to remove all that stood between us and God so that we could enter into a personal relationship with them (become part of His Family) and enjoy all the benefits of this relationship. This was an act of Grace, an expression of His Love towards us!

It is The Gospel of The Kingdom. The fact we are transferred, by our faith in Jesus, from being a citizen of the kingdom of Satan (the world system he rules) to becoming a citizen of The Kingdom of God with all the subsequent rights, roles, responsibilities and rewards.

It is not just the Gospel of Salvation (which is the power of God to save us) but it also includes the entrance to the relationship with God (Salvation), our citizenship in the Kingdom of God with the resultant delegated authority to defeat Satan and overthrow him and all his kingdom tries to snare us with. It is the entirety of the relationship we enter into, as part of His Family, which is then expressed in our lives as we represent Him and serve Him in gratitude and loving obedience.

Salvation is a relationship with Jesus and The Father (John 17:3) guided by The Holy Spirit, and we keep our deliverance by cultivating our complete relationship with God as a member of His Family.

How do we cultivate these relationships wish The Father, Jesus and The Holy Spirit? By learning all we can about Jesus and The Father and by spending time talking to Their representative, The Holy Spirit. He teaches us about Jesus and The Father and how to relate to Them as well as what They require of us when it is not plainly clear from Their guidebook (The Bible).

It would be foolish to ignore these relationships, as these relationships are the basis of our eternal life (our citizenship in Heaven). So, each day you need to study The Bible, in which we learn about these relationships, as well as talk to Jesus, The Father, and The Holy Spirit and listen to Their replies and the guidance through The Holy Spirit.

The relationship we enter into with Jesus is first as our Lord, then as our Saviour and step brother

The relationship we enter into with the Father is as a citizen of His Kingdom and our spiritual Father and with Jesus as the Ruler of it, which is physically now in Heaven and soon to be re-established on Earth.

The relationship we have with The Holy Spirit is as an Overseer, of whom we are His ward, whom He comforts and guides to maturity as a citizen of The Kingdom. The Holy Spirit was left on earth to teach us how to be part of God'a Family and to prepare us for eternity.

Where is the Kingdom? It is in Heaven as well as in the Body of Believers on Earth who express the Kingdom's values, guided by The Holy Spirit. It is also any territory that has been given by Jesus to rule. In essence, the Kingdom is where ever God's Rule is. Is the Kingdom of God in churches? Only in the people there in whom He is Lord. It is not in a building unless given to Him as Lord and used to show that.

Satan has his kingdom for just a little while longer until Jesus orders him to hand it back to Him for His Millennial Rule. Satan tries to get it back at the end of the 1000 year reign after he is released from the abyss. This desire of his leads to the final battle of good and evil and of the judgment of Satan and the fallen angels as well as all mankind where the followers of Jesus are rewarded and those rejecting Jesus are sent to follow Satan (their king) to his punishment (reward Gal 6:7-8).

The Christian life consists of trusting God's Love; trusting God's Purposes, trusting God's Plan for you: trusting God's Control; trusting God's Timing, and trusting His Promises. It also consists of being a faithful steward of all He has given you and of being faithful and obedient to what He asks you to do. You do this out of love of and

appreciation for Him and thankfulness for what He has done for you.

Remember, we are moved from the kingdom of darkness to the Kingdom of Light; from judgment and the wrath of God to Love and peace with God; from opposition to God to working in harmony with Him; from enmity with God to peace with God. This is why, in all things, we should give thanks, as now we are under the jurisdiction of God's Love and protected by His complete control over all our circumstances. All that happens from the moment you become a citizen of God's Kingdom occurs because God Loves you and makes it possible for you to be His Citizen and part of His Family.

# 'J' is for Jesus

Jesus came to reconcile us to God and to restore the original relationship mankind had with God in the Garden of Eden as part of God's Family. This is why salvation is a relationship and not just a singular event or an act such as "inviting Jesus into your heart" (Jn:3) You are transferred from Satan's Kingdom to God's Kingdom when you accept Jesus as your King (Lord) and are able enter into an intimate, personal, relationship with Him and The Father (John 17:3).

Jesus did all that was required at Calvary to enable us to enter in and keep this relationship, as well as to secure for eternity what He has promised us. Thus, He is the Author and Finisher of our faith (the one who makes it possible then provides all we need to mature in our faith till we reach heaven and His presence). We enter this relationship by declaring that Jesus is our Lord and God and accept Him as such in our life. We also accept all He did at Calvary and the fact of His Resurrection.

A true Christian believes Jesus came in the flesh and died on the cross and is He is the Son of God. They also accept all The Bible says and do not reject parts of it as being folk tales, mythology or tradition.

We maintain this relationship by living as He requires us to live as a citizen of the Kingdom of God and member of God's Family. This is how we keep our salvation. In essence, salvation is worked out on an ongoing basis by fulfilling our role as citizens of The Kingdom of God and thus by our obedience allowing Him to continue the work He started in us when He translated us into His kingdom of Light.

Out of love for Jesus, we should try and think as He does and do as He would do toward others, to love them as He loves them, putting their needs before our own being directed by The Holy Spirit in these things. Love, however, never does for another what they should be doing for themselves; unless, they are unable to do it or need help doing it.

### The two 'W's

God has given two witnesses to what Jesus has done. Both of them are given to help you develop this relationship with The Father and Jesus, as well as to help you know who and what you are in Jesus and what is required of you as a citizen of the Kingdom of God.

These two Witnesses are:

The Witness of The Word

The Witness of The Holy Spirit

Both of these are a necessary part of the life of citizens of the Kingdom who truly want to relate to and serve their King as they are required to do. Both of these witness to Jesus and The Fathers' plans for you. The Word purifies you as you meditate on it and as it resides in you. The Word also moulds you to be like your King. There is much The Word does and a study on The Word and its effects on people is worth consideration (Ps 119:9-11). Remember what God says about it:

2Ti 3:16-17 All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching the truth, rebuking error, correcting faults, and giving instruction for right living, so that the person who serves God may be fully qualified and equipped to do every kind of good deed.

The Holy Spirit in you marks you as belonging to Jesus and guides and empowers you to do what the King (Jesus) desires you to do. He also instructs you in the things of The Kingdom as well as guides you when The Word is silent or unclear in the situation in which you find yourself.

Both of these witnesses need to be in place in your life, actively moulding you to the image of your King, in order for you, as a citizen, to witness effectively to The Kingdom of God. When these two witnesses are in place in your life, they will display the Kingdom of God in your life with power and authority. The sick will be healed, the prisoners will be released from the bondage of the enemy, and people will be drawn to Jesus by the quality of your life.

The seven-fold anointing of The Messiah will be upon you and your God-given ministry:

It is the anointing to release from oppression,

It is the anointing to set the captives free,

It is the anointing to proclaim liberty,

It is the anointing to declare the year of the Lord,

It is the anointing to deliver, from enemy attacks

It is the anointing to set the spiritually blind free.

The anointing for deliverance ministry is included in one of the two ministries of our Lord and is mentioned in Isaiah 61:1,2 which was quoted by Jesus at the start of His Ministry with the disciples as the evidences of His being The Messiah. Remember that these seven anointings refer to spiritual areas, but their outward workings will be seen in the physical realm as demonic bondages are removed and healing and restoration occurs. One who is a mature 'son of god' moves in all these areas.

The work of Jesus before He died can be summarized as follows:

Proclaim and demonstrate the Gospel of The Kingdom in power and glory.

Teach about the Kingdom of Heaven and the King's requirements of His citizens.

Our lives should reflect the two 'W's, and we should know them so well that they should become a natural expression in all we do. If we do not know them, we cannot express them. If we do not know what God teaches, we cannot express His Rule in our life and teach others these things. If we do not know the Holy Spirit we can neither be led by Him in all we do, nor can He express the gifts we have been given that empower us as Jesus requires us to be so we serve Him as He desires us too and not as we think we should.

### The Three 'P's

His Protection, His Provision, His Providence.

God loves everyone and desires that all will be saved from the kingdom of darkness.

That is why He sustains the evil people in this world in the hope they will repent. Our response to this Love determines whether we spend eternity with Him or in hell with His enemy.

# **His Protection**

As a citizen of His Kingdom, He protects us from harm as long as we obey Him and have not removed any part of ourselves from His Kingdom. We remove parts of ourselves from His Kingdom through having an incorrect attitude in an area of our life and through wilfully sinning. When we remove a part of our life from His control (Lordship) we no longer are a part of His Kingdom and God's Family. Lordship must be 100%. Remember earth is where we prepare the attitudes we will have in heaven.

Confession of the sin, repenting and giving the area to Him to be Lord of, restores this part of ourselves to the Kingdom of God and to His Protection once again. Anything not given to Jesus can be attacked by Satan, often successfully. Anything given to Jesus cannot be attacked by Satan successfully because we do not want what Satan offers.

# His Provision

God provides for all the needs of every living person. He also gives us what we need to minister to Him and for Him (Matt 6:33). If we do not seek His Will we will desire more than we need or things we do not need, both of which will side track or hinder us as we seek to serve Jesus.

There are three levels in this provision and each lower level is included in and necessary for the subsequent ones.

In ascending levels these are:

Our basic needs to exist as a person and know the salvation He offers (for non-Christians)

Our additional needs in order to serve Him (for Christians who want to serve Him)

Our rewards for serving Him (For His faithful servants)

These areas apply to our life on Earth as well as eternity in Heaven, (which is just a continuation of the relationship and service with Him we have on earth).

### **His Providence**

His Providence means He controls all things for His purposes and for our good and that all that happens is for our best (Genesis 50:20, Romans 8:28).

God is Love, and this is the basis for evaluating all He does to us and for us. Any other evaluation of His motives results in complaining and thanklessness and causes us to question His Love for us. This is why we are told to be always thankful for whatever happens, even though we cannot see God's Purposes in them at the time, as what happens is an expression of His love, and we should be grateful for that.

Remember, His plans are more important than our plans. We cannot fully understand the plans the mind of God with our finite mind, so we should not question them. Questioning the ways of God does not give us understanding and may even make us more negative toward His workings in our lives (Isaiah 55:8,9 and Deuteronomy 29:29). He will always tell us what we need to know.

God does not punish us for our actions but for our thought behind the action which is why to just consider to act on a wrong action is sin without it actually being carried out.

#### The four 'R's

Relationships, rights, responsibilities and rewards. Salvation is a relationship that gives us certain rights. These rights mean we have responsibilities and as well as rewards for carrying out our responsibilities.

# **Relationships:**

We relate to:

God

The Father

As a child of and an adopted son

As a citizen of His Kingdom

As a worshipper of

A beneficiary of His Love

### The Son

As our Lord

As our Saviour

As our Friend

As His step brother/sister

### The Holy Spirit

As students of

As His temple (His vehicle in this world)

As our Guide and Comforter

As our empowerer

#### Others

Inside or outside our family

Those under our authority (we serve them)

Those in authority over us (We obey them)

People we are sent to minister too (serve)

People sent to minister to us

# Ourselves

Our body - to keep it fit for the work of The Kingdom

Our soul (mind) - to keep it sound and focused on The Kingdom

Our Spirit - to keep it in harmony with The King and His Kingdom

#### **Rights:**

To serve God and then, as directed by Him, His citizens and others

To expect the support and protection of The King

To approach the King and expect a hearing

To have our needs met so we can serve Him (as all is His and we are only stewards of what He has so if He does not give it to us we cannot serve Him)

These are rights granted by The King because of our relationship to Him and not

because of anything we ourselves have done.

# **Responsibilities:**

To do what the King directs us to do

To defend the King, His Will (rules and laws), His Name (His Character) and promote His Kingdom

To be good stewards of what The King has entrusted us with

To learn His laws and what He requires of us

Remember that ministry is first to God. Then, He will tell us where and when and in what way He wants us to serve Him. It is wrong to talk about 'our' ministry. We, as citizens of the Kingdom, do not have our own ministry. What we do have is service to the King and then to others as directed by our King. This means we minister in seasons as He directs us and uses these seasons to teach us and mould us in an area. These seasons are the way He matures us into His image (Character) so we can be like Him in thought and action.

# God Given Rewards (Gal 6:7,8):

His eternal presence with us in heaven

His eternal provision for our needs in heaven and beyond

Rewards in Heaven (including a mansion to live in with Him for eternity

Rewards of additional spiritual responsibility (promotion on earth) and the resultant appropriate empowerment

# How to Hear The Holy Spirit

This is a quick guide on hearing The Holy Spirit as you need to know how to hear Him so you can walk in His guidance and understanding. You cannot be a 'son of god if you cannot hear The Holy Spirit.

Unless The Holy Spirit or Satan actually appear to you, they can only talk to you in your mind. When they are speaking it is as if they are your own thoughts or that you are talking to yourself. People mistake this for a disorder when demons are there speaking audibly in your mind, as if there are apparently two personalities in them. Also when The Holy Spirit is speaking, they usually think it is their own thoughts.

If it is not our thoughts then it is either one or the other, The Holy Spirit or Satan. You can actually hold a conversation with the Holy Spirit and ask Him questions and He will answer if it is appropriate to answer. Satan will also try to have you accept his answer but it will not give you the peace the answer of The Holy Spirit's answer will.

You will need to silence your mind. You may have trouble hearing Him (The Holy Spirit) especially if you are in a place full of distractions or in a place where Satan rules. Remember He, the Holy Spirit, has a still, small (quiet) voice.

He will place an impression, picture, or thought in your mind, give you an emotion, or even speak to you in an audible voice. You will know it is from Him as it will not cause you to fear. He may speak in other ways than these, but these are the normal ways. You may feel a check in your spirit which is a 'no'. If He does not reply it is also a 'no' or it is not time for you to know the answer.

The answer He gives will line up with The Bible, and you will have peace in your heart over it. Remember, God will not contradict His Word.

Remember that Satan will try and cause you doubt about what you are hearing then cause you to reason so you will believe it is wrong or impossible so that you are not

hearing correctly. Or at times he will block you hearing The Holy Spirit so you need to cast him out and stop him doing this then ask The Holy Spirit again what you need to know.

### **On Temptation**

To keep your deliverance you will need to avoid falling into sin when tempted.

### What is temptation?

Temptation is an enticement to sin, either from demons or our desires of our 'flesh'.

### How does temptation occur?

Temptation occurs when you take you eyes off God and His revealed will and look at the pleasures of the world. When you desire them more than the revealed will of God sin occurs.

It involves turning a 'blind eye' to the consequences of the temptation.

### What is the mechanism of temptation?

(James 1:13-15 KJV) Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man: But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death.

(1 John 2:15-16 CEV) Do not love the world or the things in the world. If you love the world, the love of the Father is not in you. These are the ways of the world: wanting to please our sinful selves, wanting the sinful things we see, and being too proud of what we have. None of these come from the Father, but all of them come from the world.

#### What is the promise of God in regards to temptation?

(1 Cor 10:13 CEV) The only temptation that has come to you is that which everyone has. But you can trust God, who will not permit you to be tempted more than you can stand. But when you are tempted, he will also give you a way to escape so that you will be able to stand it.

### What is the warning of God in regards to temptation

(1 Cor 10:12 NCV) If you think you are strong, you should be careful not to fall.

#### What is the promise to overcomers?

(James 1:12 KJV) Blessed is the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him.

### Satan will try and get you to accept things you have been delivered from

He will try and convince you that you have not been delivered so you will once again give him the right to enter you and keep that temptation going in you. This is where you need to ask The Holy Spirit if the demon is inside you or outside of you so you know whether you need to cast him into the abyss or do deliverance using 'The Five Steps'.

It an area of temptation is difficult to fight then it is probable deliverance is needed in that area. If it is irregular and easy to cast to the abyss then it is an external demon trying to get in. Remember to deal with the basic (root) causes of these temptations if deliverance is needed and not the results of the oppression.

### Focus on Jesus

The whole purpose of Satan is to take your focus off Jesus and the things He desires you to do so that Satan can replace them with his things and desires for you. One important facet of keeping your deliverance is to focus on Jesus and His things and to ignore the things of Satan. (Col 3:1-3)

### Attitudes that will help you keep your deliverance

It is one thing to have salvation and another to continue on from there walking in this deliverance from Satan in your daily life.

Each day start off with confirming the relationship with God and thanking Him for His Love towards you. I usually pray:

Good morning Father, Jesus, Holy Spirit. Thank You for this day. Thank you Father for your provision and your angels that minister to me and protect me. Than You Jesus for your protection and delegated authority. Thank You Holy Spirit for protecting my mind and guiding me today.

Guard your mind as to what it accepts as input into your soul and spirit. This will help keep your 'temple of God' pure. The best input is The Bible and mediation on the Bible. Sound teaching is also good in whatever form you hear it.

Develop personal intimacy with The Father, Jesus and The Holy Spirit and learn to hear their voice as they speak to you through The Bible, your conscience, your mind's thoughts and Godly counsel.

Don't talk to people about your salvation if they do not believe in it (unless The Holy Spirit tells you too) but tell those who need it and are willing to accept it about how Jesus set you free and what He offers them.

DO NOT SEEK MIRACLES AND SIGNS. Develop personal; intimacy with Jesus and these will be a natural result. If you seek them before seeking God you make them into an idol and Satan may be able to give you his brand of miracles. Anything placed before God and His purposes is an idol. Anything that causes you to sin is an idol.

Do not seek prosperity as the world measures it. God's prosperity will naturally result from the relationship you have with Him (Mat 6:33). It will be prosperity as God wants and not as Satan wants you to have it. Satan's prosperity will lead you astray from God and bind you up in the world and its system.

Remove all from your house that is ungodly. Ask The Holy Spirit to show you what to remove. Dedicate your house and all in it to Jesus and His Kingdom if you are its owner. If renting then the area rented can be dedicated.

Keep every area of your life under the Lordship (authority, requirements and purposes) of Jesus. If Satan does attack and Jesus is your Lord of that area then you will not fall. Personal holiness is a get help in this.

Show God's Love to all around you. Develop the mind (attitudes and thought patterns) of Jesus. Develop the Fruit of The Holy Spirit in your life.

Continually walk in fellowship with Jesus talking to Him, The Father and The Holy Spirit as you walk through life. This will stop your mind being invaded by demons. If your mind is caught up with Jesus and His things Satan cannot successfully place his thoughts in it.

In everything give thanks as this is the will of God for you. He has either caused it to happen or allowed it to happen for your best interests.

# In Summary

We should express the same love to all as The Father does, in that He loves everyone, not just those who are in a correct relationship with Him. He hates their sin, but He loves them as His Children as He created them and they are still His children.

We should ask The Holy Spirit what the Father's will is for us to perform in regard to a person or matter, then do it. If the Holy Spirit is silent, then we must use the guidelines of The Bible as to how we are to relate to others (in love: in sound, positive, edifying speech; in having a servant heart, etc.) illustrating the character of The Father and Jesus.

Because God is Love, we can wholeheartedly trust Him as we interact with Him. His love keeps us in the Kingdom and helps us to stay there. We can trust His Love in all things. The moment we start to doubt God's Love, we start to fall from the main guiding principle of The Kingdom: faith and trust in His Love. That is why Satan always tries to have us doubt God's Love.

# How to Live Each Day

As we obey God in all the small things we do each day as we are guided by The Holy Spirit and The Bible, in there doing we turn our life into a worship offering as we show, by our actions, that God and His guidelines are worthy of being followed in all things, not just the 'important' things. Christian living is not a matter of doing great things for God but doing well the everyday, mundane tasks He gives us to do. Few of us will do 'great things' for God on a regular basis, but all of us can do properly the little things He asks us to do each day.

When you do all things out of Love for Jesus and His Kingdom (so He gets all The Glory) and for the one in need, you satisfy the requirements of God.

### So we should

Put Jesus first in everything

Do everything in God's quality of Love

Obey the Bible

Develop the relationship you have with God as a citizen of His Kingdom and a member of His Family

Listen to the Holy Spirit's guidance

Cast out every negative or wrong thought in Jesus' Name and ask The Holy Spirit to replace them with His.

In everything give thanks to the Lord Jesus and The Father

Never doubt God's Love, Control, Purpose and Plans for you. If you do there is nothing left to replace it but your own efforts and our failure using these is what has driven us to God in the first place.

### **Christian Dissatisfaction**

If you question something God has done, consider it was the wrong thing to do, complain about it or question what He has done you are saying He has made a mistake and is not perfect therefore in your eyes He no longer is God and you cannot believe anything He says in The Bible. This also applies to saying God should have done something or He is not going to do it now without actually being told these things by Him.

Be careful what you say about the workings of God in case you call Him into question

and by this imply you believe He is not God.

You need to take The Bible as a whole or throw it away and forget about Jesus and what He did.

Mat 6:33 lifestyle requires a complete trust in God, and an unquestioning belief that God is Love, all He does is out of this Love and best for you, that He is a rewarder and it is all worth it all in the end (1 Cor 15:58).
