

For New Christians Bk 2

Daily Prayers

Every morning when you wake up you should pray the following prayers.

Thank you for this day Father, Lord Jesus, Holy Spirit, May it be to your Glory. -

Good morning my Father. Thank you for your provision each day of all my needs on earth and which also prepares me to be in heaven with you.

Thank you that you forgive me my sins if I forgive others their sins against me.

Good morning Lord Jesus my spiritual step-brother.

Thank you for your protection each day that protects me and all that The Father has given to me and that will never allow Satan to test me beyond what I can endure and that you will provide away for me to deal with the attack.

Thank you also for the delegated authority over Satan you have given to me that allows me to defeat the attacks of Satan

Good morning Holy Spirit thank you that you guide me and teach me each day to live as I should and hear what God desires me to do today.

THEN COMMAND THE FOLLOWING

In Jesus' Name I command every plan, action, activity or any other type of action or activity against me (and my family) be null and void and in Jesus' Name I command the demons to be paralysed and go to the Throne of Judgment and to take what they have done to us, with them

I ask you Holy Spirit to replace them and heal any type of damage they have done to me.

Thank you Father Lord Jesus Holy Spirit .

In The evening you should pray something like this

Good night My Father, my step-brother Jesus And my wise mentor Holy Spirit.

Thank you for all you have done for me Today.

Please grant me (and my family) a good nights sleep and protect every area of it please.

If the rapture occurs tonight please take me (and my family) with you.

NOTE

Jesus said that the evening before you go to sleep in a special time to pray so it is a good time to pray and make your requests To God.

The morning is a good time to give Him the day and make requests for what you will need during The day.

Remember what Paul Said:

Php 4:6 Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.

Php 4:7 And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

God is a Servant

God is not a hypocrite, telling us to do something in The Bible and not doing it Himself

A good example is found in Matt 20:26-27

But it shall not be so among you: but whosoever will be great among you, let him be your minister;

And whosoever will be chief among you, let him be your servant:

God is great amongst us ministering to our needs we know about and tell Him about.

He is also a servant meeting our needs we do not know about and does all He can to help us go to heaven to be with Him.

He is a quiet, gentle, servant doing many things we need done but did not know we needed them done.

What God has done for you

Have you ever really stopped to consider what God has done for you?

He gave you life!

You did not know you were not alive.

He did not need to make you, but He made you because of all the joy you would have with Him in heaven.

He made mankind to be His Friend but mankind rejected this friendship.

He realised mankind could not remove the obstacles to be able to be His friend again. So He sent Jesus to remove the barriers that stopped us relating to God.

He did not need to do this but did so out of His love for us.

He guided you to follow Jesus as Lord and did everything for this to happen to you because of how much benefit we would obtain from the relationship with him that resulted.

He places His Presence in you so that you are always in contact with Him and so He can guide you personally. There is no longer any need to go to a special building to worship Him.

He adopted us as His Children so that He became our spiritual Father, The Lord Jesus became our spiritual step brother and The Holy Spirit became like a wise uncle helping us His nephew or niece.

He provides all we need to live as He desires us to live and to prepares to be in heaven with Him.

When we die He takes us to heaven where He has prepared a place for us to live in to enjoy all the wonderful things He has made for us, His Children, where we will live in happiness with Him for ever.

Sin. Its cause

Sin is deliberate disobedience to the Will of God.

It means you do not love Him sufficiently to obey Him.

It does not result from making a choice between things God would like you to think or do and you choose the wrong choice, something else, which Satan wants you to do. Sin is deliberate disobedience to a commandment of God once you know the action is wrong in the eyes of God.

Sin is:

- It is primarily a rejection of God's Love

- It is a belief you know better than God what you need

- It makes something an idol as it displaces God's Will for you in the area sinned in

- It breaks the family relationship you have with God and other Christians

- It breaks fellowship with The Holy Spirit

- It loses you eternal life

- It loses God's Favour

- It loses God's Blessings

- You no longer belong to God's Kingdom but to the kingdom of His enemy

- You are no longer on the path God is using to train you for heaven

The cause of sin

Every sin is result of a wrong attitude towards God's Love, either from indifference to it, lust or a rejection (rebellion against) it.

The first two sins in the garden illustrate this

In the first sin, Adam's indifference towards God's love made him a bad steward of the Garden and of Eve, allowing her to be in a situation where Satan could tempt her.

Satan came along and made her doubt God's love as it appeared. He did not want her to know the difference between good and evil,. So she disobeyed God not trusting His love toward her.

This is why Jesus' command, to love others as He Loves them, is pivotal to the Christian life. e is not indifferent to our love neither rejects our free will.

Sin is a bad stewardship of God's Love. We love our wrong desire more than we love God,so e deal with them incorrectly in a way God does not want something dealt with and as a result, and sin.

The first time something happens in The Bible is the basis on which to look at all other events of a similar nature and when we examine all of them that we call sin, we find it is a love of our desires and a rejection of what God desires us to do out of our love for him.

Adam was to be a good steward of the garden of Eden and if he had loved God, he would not have been a bad steward (caretaker of the garden) which resulted in Eve eating the forbidden fruit. Hers was the second sin.

If you examine all sin, you will find a lust is behind it (1 Jn 2:15-16)

Lust is the expression of your flesh which is opposition to God so that it does not do what God desires it to do. And as you disobey God you show a lack of love for His Things and fall short of His requirements of you.

If you love God you will be a good steward of everything He gives you to look after for Him,of which our love for Him, and its expression, is the most important. After all, salvation is having a correct love relationship with God and The Father guided by The Holy Spirit and it is His Love for us and what He have done for us, that drives us to serve Him correctly and to love Him.

Evangelism is an example of this as it is just telling others what God has done for you out of Love for you and can do for them because of His Love for them.

Why do you sin?

You accept the suggestions of Satan to sin for a few reasons:

You like the pleasure the sin gives you.

You do not realise the suggestion is from Satan and not your own mind.

You do not know how to deal with the temptation so end up doing it. You believe the lie Satan tells you that you cannot defeat the temptation..

You cannot see the way of escape God has given you.

It also feeds your self-esteem or desires in some way

As a result:

The thing causing the sin has become an idol being placed before the Will of God

You have ignored the physical and spiritual results of the sin.

You have pleasure you should not have

Satan is now your Lord and if you do not repent you will go to hell when you die.

Confession and Repentance

Confession just means to admit something

It can be a positive or negative admission. For example:

Positive: Confess the Lord Jesus or

Negative: Lord Jesus I admit I have sinned.

There is only one mediator between God and Man Jesus Christ.

1Ti 2:5 For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus;

No man can forgive your sins. His promise is to forgive you if you really confess your sins:

1Jn 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

He mediates between you and The Father so that when you confess your sin He tells The Father and you are restored to The Family of God!

In James 5:16 we are told to confess (admit) our fault to another so that they can encourage and help us. We are not told to confess our sins which is a catholic Tradition and which is not on the proper Bible

If you do not confess your sin to Jesus you are not part of God's family and will go to hell!

Remember you are confessing to a person, so it must be from the heart because you offended the love of someone who deeply loves you!

Repentance.

The idea behind this is the turning away from something and not doing it again.

If we truly love Jesus we will repent from sin so we do not disappoint His love!

If you repent and cannot stop doing the sin then you may need deliverance

There is a deliverance prayer you can say that is on the first page of this website.

Repentance must be from the heart so the heart is purified. If it is not purified then you have not really repented.

Communion

This document talks about the communion ceremony and how different it is now to the way it was celebrated in the early church.

Communion is worship and thanksgiving with our Christian family in an assembly with Jesus in our midst, our most important family member.

Early communion was a 'love' feast to remember what The Father had done through Jesus and a witness to the reality of Jesus and His Work of Redemption.

What is a communion?

The first thing to say is that Jesus said:

Jesus said: Mat 18:20 that where two or three are gathered together in His name (His purposes), He is in the midst of them.

So, where Christians are gathered together for the purposes of the Kingdom Jesus, such as communion, is in their midst. Yet His presence is usually never acknowledged!

He is there and they say they gather to remember Him but yet ignore His presence.

The Communion in the first few centuries celebrated what The Father had done and was thanksgiving to Him for the redemption He gave us through Jesus.

It did not focus on death of Jesus on the cross.

The Didache has chapters on communion and show how it was celebrated in the early church and shows how vastly different it is to what is passed off as communion these days.

The Emphasis was on thanking The Father for our redemption in the early communion celebration.

Jesus said we were to pray to The Father and the first part of the communion is to thank The Father for His provision that made redemption possible and then to Jesus for carrying out what was required for our redemption.

Modern Communion

The Father's role is ignored in the modern celebration of communion yet the emphasis in the early celebration of communion was to thank The Father for redemption and then Jesus was thanked for doing what was necessary to obtain it for us!

So, our pattern for prayer should always be:

Thank The Father for His Provision

The Lord Jesus for carrying it out and protecting it

The Holy Spirit for guiding us in what to do during the celebration.

This should be the pattern for remembrance in communion and any prayers during it

It is not a sombre service celebrating the suffering of Calvary but a celebration of the life we have though redemption now and later in heaven.

As an aside:

Jesus drank the cup of Redemption but could not drink the cup of completion which meant that the Redemption was incomplete

The fact Redemption was not complete until He died was a sign to the Apostles that He was The Messiah

Speech

Pro 23:7 For as he thinketh in his heart, so is he: Eat and drink, saith he to thee; but his heart is not with thee.

Jas 3:10 Out of the same mouth proceedeth blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not so to be.

Our speech reflects our heart, thus the warning in Matt 12:36-37 and the advice found in Tit 2:8

Mat 12:35 A good man out of the good treasure of the heart bringeth forth good things: and an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things.

Mat 12:36 But I say unto you, That every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment.

Mat 12:37 For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned.

Tit 2:8 Sound speech, that cannot be condemned; that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you.

sound speech does three things:

It shows your heart is right with God

It Glorifies God because you are speaking what He suggests

Shows the Holy Spirit is guarding your speech either then or you are speaking what He

taught you earlier.

We are told what to focus on in Phil 4:8 so that our speech will always be encouraging, timely, constructive and will build people up.

So when Jesus judges you, your words will not condemn you but will justify you.

1Co 11:31 For if we would judge ourselves, we should not be judged.

In other words:

If we examine our actions and judge them correctly; no one will be able to condemn us for them.

To judge them correctly would be to make certain they are in accordance with the Will of God.

There is where our will plays a part as that determines the inputs into our life and discerns whether they are Godly or not.

In other words, whether you end up in heaven or hell depends on your will!

If it chooses Godly inputs and makes Godly decisions and expresses these only, you end up in heaven.

This shows the importance of knowing the Will of God and Hearing The Holy Spirit so that you correctly understand it.

This is why you have no one else but yourself to blame whether you end up in heaven or hell.

Cults

A cult is anyone calling themselves Christian who:

Does not believe in the incarnation or the divinity of Jesus

Does not portray salvation or redemption correctly

Who does not believe in The Holy Spirit or His Work

Who does not believe any part of The Bible which means people using modern bibles unknowingly belong to a cult as it leaves out 20% of the true Bible.

After Death

Why speak about death?

Death is the doorway to the next world and you are there a long time so you need to be prepared properly for it.

Where you end up after death will be determined by your desire to Know God and how He is revealed in The Bible so that you relate to Him correctly in a personal way.. You alone will be responsible for your fate after death. It is your decisions that got you where you end up.

The king you are serving when you die is the one whose kingdom you go to after death which is why it is always a good practice to be always right with God no matter what the cost.

The Father is waiting to receive you in heaven and Jesus is on earth helping to protect you and limit what Satan can do to you so you can do all The Father requires of you so that you can be with The Father in heaven.

So, remember, God made you so He could show His Love toward you and for no other reason except He wanted to be friends with you in an intimate personal relationship. This realization should affect how we approach God and everything He asks us to do for Him!

This is why you need to :

Strengthening your faith

Pursue Holiness

Pursue Lordship

Be a good steward of all God gives you to look after and do for Him

Show God's Quality of Love in all you do

Develop the intimate, personal, relationship you have with God

Seek to develop His Character in you

Learn to be able to hear The Holy Spirit clearly so He can guide and teach you how to live the Christian life

Study The Bible to know its truths and learn how to apply it. Meditating on the Bible will help you in this.

Perform the work of The Kingdom and show that Jesus and The Kingdom of The Father are real.

Conduct spiritual warfare and free souls from hell (casting out demons, evangelism and deliverance ministry)

To maintain the personal relationship, you have with Jesus and The Father

Things that stop you going to heaven are:

Jesus is not 100% your Lord

Unforgiveness

Not wanting to give up a sin

Not loving people like The lord Jesus says too, when He says too

Note having a personal relationship with Jesus so that prayers and activities are not from the heart but are religious and done as a matter of habit rather than a cry from the heart to Jesus

Pride in your state as a Christian so that you religiously do things and not do them for Jesus but to be noticed by other.

Sins you no longer do but have not officially repented of or confessed them to Jesus

Anything that alters your appearance from how God made you and is no medically justified: clothing, jewellery, tattoos, hairstyles, cosmetic surgery. Anything you do to yourself that promotes pride in yourself rather than in your relationship to Jesus.

Worshipping idols apart from Jesus: TV, Movie stars, Sports stars, Actors and performers, activities you do - anything that distracts you from Jesus.

It is your choice whether you do these things or not and your choice will determine whether you go to heaven or hell.
